Distribution of Holy Communion

We have restored the chalice at the distribution of holy communion. Receiving holy communion in both kinds is voluntary, and will be a personal decision for each person to make. Current advice is that you must drink from the chalice and not intinct (dip) the host into the chalice.

Our Patronal Festival (St Margaret's Day) this year will be on Sunday 17 July. Our preacher this year will be the Revd Bridget de Mello who is the Assistant Priest at our MMU sister church of St Luke, Ilford, and before ordination was a member of St Margaret's congregation. After the Eucharist, to continue our Patronal Festival celebrations this year we will be having a barbecue in the church grounds, thanks to the generous donation of a barbecue set to St Margaret's by Kathy and Paul Wicks.

Eco Tip from Eco Church - Ditch disposables.

Single-use plastic and single-use styrofoam are sourced from fossil fuels and contribute to climate change. Both materials are also known to contain carcinogens that are harmful to human health; this is particularly true when they are used for hot liquids or food, or microwaved. In a season of picnics and busyness, try to remember to 'BYOC' (Bring Your Own Container or Cutlery) for your summer snacks instead of buying disposable items. Think reusable lunch boxes or beeswax wraps. Glass jars are another good option as they are non-toxic, don't hold on to grease or food smells, and can hold liquids well too (but do mind their temperature with hot liquids).



Newbury Ward Faith Engagement with the police


